†† SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS for the Paper on SHAKESPEARE, &c. The Paper is divided into three Sections, viz. A, B, and C. The answers to each Section have to be kept apart from the answers to the other Sections and given up separately. Remember, therefore, to read the instructions at the head of the Paper and not to answer any part of a question from one Section on the same sheet as an answer to a question from another Section.

\* Every Candidate taking Plant, Object, Memory, and Life Drawing must see that (s)he receives in the Examination Room a printed Paper of Directions as well as a sheet of white Drawing Paper, and every Candidate taking Colour Drawing a printed Paper of Directions and a sheet of coloured Pastel Paper. Every Candidate taking Painting must receive a printed Paper of Directions but must come provided with a Whatman board (or Whatman paper) 14" x 9½".

N.B.—Plant Drawing. Candidates are recommended to place the plant provided in water. For this purpose they should bring a jar or vase.  
† The Practical Papers in Chemistry (A 2 hours, B 2½ hours) and in Handicraft (Woodwork 3 hours, Metalwork 3 hours) must be worked on FRIDAY, JULY 8.
